How to Join a Local 4-H Horse Club...

Each county has local 4-H clubs for youth from 8 to 18 years of age. Some counties have programs for youth of other ages. Programs and activities are available for youth who own a horse, as well as for youth who do not own a horse or have access to a horse.

Follow these steps for more information about joining a 4-H club or 4-H horse activities in your area...

1. Contact your local Penn State Cooperative Extension office.

Each county office maintains a list of local 4-H clubs and leaders of those clubs. The county 4-H extension educator or other county extension staff should be able to provide information about local and regional 4-H horse activities and direct you to the leaders of horse clubs in your area.

2. Contact the club leaders. Club leaders will provide information about when and where the club meets and will give instructions on how to sign up for the 4-H Program.
3. Attend club meeting to meet 4-H members, officers, leaders and 4-H families.
