PRODUCTION HERD FEEDING and BST

The milking herd is divided into several groups. The number of groups depends on the number of research projects being conducted. Dairy Comp 305 lists the various groups and the number of animals in each group.

The entire herd is currently milked two times per day.

The TIE-STALL GROUP is <u>potentially</u> made up of research project animals, fresh animals that are monitored and a HOSPITAL GROUP. The Hospital Group includes those animals under veterinary care, mastitis infection, injury or illness requiring them to be separated from the herd and or having to make sure that their treated milk is discarded. When the tie-stall barn is at capacity with research animals, the hospital group and fresh cows will be housed in either the heifer free-stall barn or milk cow free-stall barn.

The number of different rations fed to cows will vary depending on research projects being conducted. The complex manager and the feeder will have this information.

BST - The following criteria will be used for <u>Non-Research</u> animals. If an animal is on a research project, check on how the PI wants this handled.

- 1. Every other Monday a list of cows will be printed from DC 305 showing BST eligible animals: >62 DIM and health okay.
- 2. BST will be discontinued on all animals 1 month prior to dry off.
